## the most protection

As we prepare to celebrate our independence as a nation, it is important to reflect upon the principles which form the moral foundation of our Constitution, as set forth in the Declaration of Independence.

"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness."

These truths are the building blocks for basic human rights and require, by their inherent sacredness, legal protection for all human beings.
